



Rough conditions in Karlshamn

Third round of the European Cup & Scandinavian Tour did present very tough water conditions to the drivers. Ugis Gross Latvia did once again demonstrate his skill winning the Grand Final.



Friday was sunny and no wind. 17 drivers were on site for the third round. The Portugese Duarte Benavente was in Karlshamn, but unfortunately he did not bring his own boat. Duarte was here to assist Josef Robayan, after he did get his boat ready after crash in Portugal in first round of World Cup.

Johan Osterberg did nosedive on his first lap of Qualifying 1. Also Roger Skalman had bad luck. He did barrel roll in turn five. None were hurt at all. In Qualifying 2 Rick Hakonsen did nosedive in full speed. Not even Rick was hurt at all. The safety systems and the Resque did work perfect. Olle Martin Finland did win the Super Pole on a 43,94 lap in front of Ugis Gross 45,24 and Uvis Slakteris 45,58. Marit Stromoy did follow on 47,48 and Josef Robayan Kuwait on a safe longer timing. Rick Hakonsen did not be ready for Super Pole and earned six spot after Qualifying 2

14 drivers did start in Sprint 1. Ugis Gross did win in front of Uvis Slakteris and Marit Stromoy. Olle Martin did finish fourth, new Rockie Erik Stark Sweden fifth, and Gennady Tuchkov Latvia on a sixth position. Uvis Slakteris did win Sprint 2 in front of Ugis Gross, Marit Stromoy, Olle Martin, Mikki Fors and Michael Kristensen Denmark, best result for Michael ever in Formula 2000.

For the Grand Final there were still 12 drivers remaining. It was a great final under very tough water conditions, but the sun was shining. No incidents at all. Ugis did win again. Uvis Slakteris did win a second position and Marit Stromoy again on a third. Michael Kristenson on a very good 7th position. Also Nick Bisterfeld Germany, a rockie of this year, did perform well, finished 10th. Unfortunately Josef Robayan did not start in the Grand Final. We do not know if

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the water conditions were too heavy or the boat too nose heavy. Josef did present the first Formula 2000 boat with crash boxes installed.

Next round is Tonsberg in Norway August 4. Be sure, also Tonsberg will be a great event.

Oskar Samuelson did win Race one and Tobias Jansson won second race. In the Grand Final we saw Daniel Sparring take the pace. Oskar Samuelssn as a Rockie ended second in front of second Rockie Simone Schuft Germany. This means we have now seen seven Teams 2007.

Eight Teams are invited to the Formula Four World Tour 2007 in the Middle East. Decided is, that eight Teams will load their equipment after the final race in Stockholm September 1st for a Tour visiting Saud Arabia and Malaysia.

Next race is in Drammen August 18 and Final race is in Stockholm September 1st.

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
